#### WHAT TO EXPECT

Plan for enough time to have a meaningful travel consultation. During the visit you'll complete paperwork, watch a short video, and meet with a travel nurse who is trained in travel medicine. The nurse will review your medical history and give you information and recommendations on how to keep yourself healthy. You'll also receive your recommended immunizations and written prescriptions. To speed up your visit, go to swuhealth.gov/travel to download and complete paperwork and watch the travel video prior to your appointment.

A printout that identifies your specific risk factors and fact sheets on all recommended vaccines and medications will be reviewed.

You may receive immunizations at your first visit.
